




DUDLEY WILLIAM CARMALT JONES

FROM 1919 TILL 1946 UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO & EMERITUS PROFESSOR






OXFORD UNIVERSITY 1893 - 1900

- GRADUATED BA OXON IN 1896 FROM CORPUS CHRISTI COLLEGE OXFORD
- IN 1903 TOOK HIS MA OXON, AND GRADUATED B.M. B.CH FROM ST MARYS HOSPITAL LONDON
- DM OXON 1911, FRCP 1914 AND FRACP 1938
- WAS ASSISTANT IN SIR ALMROTH WRIGHT'S DEPT. OF THERAPEUTIC INOCULATION AT WESTMINSTER HOSPITAL. IN 1912 HE
 WAS APPOINTED DEAN OF WESTMINSTER MEDICAL SCHOOL
- HE WAS A FRIEND OF ALEXANDER FLEMING (PENICILLIN), UNTIL OLD AGE.
- 1919 APPOINTED PROFESSOR OF SYSTEMATIC MEDICINE AT OTAGO (PART TIME) AND ALLOWED PRIVATE PRACTICE
- RETIRED HIS CHAIR IN 1939 BUT WORKED ON IN THE MEDICAL SCHOOL TILL 1945
- RETIRING TO EDGEWARE ENGLAND IN 1946



WAR SERVICE 1914-1918

- AS A TERRITORIAL OFFICER HE WENT FIRST TO FLANDERS IN 1914
- SUBSEQUENTLY HE WAS STATIONED AT NO. 4 STATIONERY HOSPITAL.
 - AT ARQUES NEAR ST OMER, SERVING THE IST AND 2ND ARMIES. A TENTED HOSPITAL IN THE GROUNDS OF A CHATEAU.
- CONSULTING PHYSICIAN TO THE EGYPTIAN EXPEDITIONARY FORCE.
- MEETING DR HERCUS IN THE SINAI IN 1919
 LED TO HIS DUNEDIN APPOINTMENT.
- PICTURED HERE AS A CAPTAIN RAMC 1914.
- REACHED THE RANK OF COLONEL. IN 1919





"SHELL SHOCK" HIS SPECIALITY – ACUTE WAR-NEURATHENIA

- ACUTE WAR-NEURASTHENIA OR 'SHELL SHOCK' WAS FIRST TREATED AS MALINGERING.
- NEURASTHENIA MEANS LITERALLY 'WEAKNESS OF NERVE'. CARMALT JONES WOULD NOT SEND THEM BACK TO THE FRONT NOT SO MUCH BECAUSE THEY WERE SICK BUT MORE THAT THEIR VALUE AS SOLDIERS WAS DIMINISHED.
- CARMALT JONES DIAGNOSED AND TREATED MORE THAN 3,000 SOLDIERS AND PUBLISHED A PAPER ON THE SUBJECT OF 1300 OF THEM.
- HE INSISTED THAT THE DEROGATORY ATTITUDES TO THE CONDITION BE RESISTED.




MARRIED MABEL TOTTENHAM 1907

- THEY HAD A DAUGHTER AND A SON, ALL TRAVELLED TO DUNEDIN WITH HIM IN 1920
- MABEL AND THE CHILDREN LEFT HIM BEHIND AND RETURNED TO THE UK 1925
- HE LIVED ALONE HERE FOR MANY YEARS TAKING COMFORT AND FRIENDSHIP FROM THE DUNEDIN CLUB, THE UNIVERSITY CLUB AND THE OTAGO UNIVERSITY ROWING CLUB.
- MABEL DIED IN 1955, HE FOLLOWED TWO YEARS LATER IN 1957.
- HIS AUTOBIOGRAPHY WAS PUBLISHED IN 2009 "A PHYSICIAN IN SPITE OF HIMSELF"
- THIS WAS ASSEMBLED AND EDITED BY DR BRIAN BARRACLOUGH FROM AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL NOTES HELD BY
 HIS LATE DAUGHTER AND THE COPYRIGHT OWNED BY HIS FOUR GRANDCHILDREN WHO AUTHORISED ITS
 PUBLICATION



FOUNDER OF THE UNIVERSITY CLUB

- FOUNDER AND FIRST PRESIDENT 1923
- WANTED A CLUB FOR RETIRING MEDICAL ACADEMICS
- SERVED A NUMBER OF YEARS ON THE EXECUTIVE
- HE REGARDED HIS APPOINTMENT TO
 DUNEDIN AS THE GREATEST ACHIEVEMENT
 OF HIS LIFE.





FOUNDER OF THE UNIVERSITY ROWING CLUB

- FOUNDED THE CLUB 16TH APRIL 1929 AT A MEETING OF THOSE INTERESTED HELD IN THE MEN'S COMMON ROOM AT THE MEDICAL SCHOOL.
 - 40 ATTENDED, DR CARMALT JONES WAS ELECTED CHAIRMAN AND THE FIRST PRESIDENT
 - VICE PRESIDENTS ELECTED WERE

 DR W P GOWLAND

DR GERALD FITZGERALD
 H P BRASCH ESQ.

- MR PARIS WAS ELECTED CLUB COACH
- 1945-46 SEASON WAS HIS LAST AS PRESIDENT AND FROM THEN ON A TROPHY, MADE BY HIM, WAS PRESENTED ANNUALLY FOR INTER-FACULTY ROWING. HE PRESENTED IT FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 1946 FITTINGLY TO THE MEDICAL FACULTY TEAM.
- TODAY IT IS A RULE OF THE CLUB THAT AT LEAST ONE BOAT IN THE SHED CARRIES HIS NAME.

HE IS IN THE CENTRE SECOND ROW.






SUMMER EIGHTS

- **EIGHTS WEEK**, ALSO KNOWN AS **SUMMER EIGHTS**, IS A FOUR-DAY REGATTA OF "BUMPS RACES" WHICH CONSTITUTES THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD'S MAIN INTERCOLLEGIATE ROWING EVENT OF THE YEAR.
- WE HOLD HIS OAR FROM THEIR SUCCESS IN THE BUMPS IN 1896.
- MEN'S AND WOMEN'S COXED EIGHTS COMPETE IN SEPARATE DIVISIONS FOR THEIR COLLEGES,
 WITH SOME COLLEGES ENTERING AS MANY AS FIVE CREWS FOR EACH SEX.
- THE FIRST OXFORD WOMAN'S ROWING COMPETITION WAS AGAINST CAMBRIDGE IN 1926
- CARMALT JONES WROTE A SONNET ON THE SUBJECT!

 FOR MOST IF NOT ALL OF IT.






- AN INTIMATE KNOWLEDGE OF THE CLASSICS

- AS AN ACADEMIC HE CREATED AN ATMOSPHERE OF HUMANE MEDICINE

- HE WAS A SKILLED ARTIST, POET AND LITERARY SCHOLAR
- HE WAS PROFICIENT IN GREEK AND LATIN
- HE MOVED STUDENTS FROM THE PREVAILING



- HIS STEP MOTHER, THREE AUNTS AND AN UNCLE LEFT MONEY FOR HIM IN THERE WILLS WHICH ACCOUNTED FOR HIS ON GOING WEALTH, AND HIS GENEROSITY.
- HE LEFT ENDOWMENTS AND/OR VALUABLE COLLECTIONS TO THE OTAGO MUSEUM AND TO THE HOCKEN.

- 1945 PUBLISHES 'DIVERSIONS OF A PROFESSOR IN NEW ZEALAND' AND ANNALS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO MEDICAL SCHOOL
