1. Exposure to Industry



Exposure is Key...

2. "Successful" Career Pathways


What does society view as "successful"?

- Obviously, doctors, engineers, lawyers, scientists.
- Huge surge in computer science/software engineering
- Increasing number of boys dropping out to enter trades. Lots get apprenticeships or go to polytechnic thanks to fees free. Successful!
- Tourism, although a massive industry, still seen as unsuccessful
- Good career pathways potentially avoided as not seen as "successful"

Family and friends also influence this...

- We know parents are very influential
- However, often lag behind in what new pathways can be successful
- Leads to many kids my age leaning in towards med, law, engineering when they maybe shouldn't (not necessarily a bad thing but...)
- Still can give their children/mates exposure to different areas






Similar to friends and family...

4. Financial Factors




Fees Free

- Obviously tougher for tertiary institutions with no international students.


To Recap:
